IACUC Congruency Reviews

The University is responsible for ensuring that all research on animals has been approved by the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC). All awards, including grants and contracts, directly funded by <u>Public</u> <u>Health Service (PHS) agencies</u>, National Science Foundation (NSF), or American Heart Association (AHA), must have an IACUC Congruency Review (formerly referred to as a GAR) before they can be activated by OSP.

REMINDER: Upcoming Changes to NIH Biographical Sketch and Other Support Format Page

For applications and Research Performance Progress Reports (RPPRs) due on or after January 25, 2022, NIH will require new formats for both the <u>biographical sketch</u> (biosketch) and the <u>Other Support</u> documents. Effective January 25, 2021, the NIH will also require:

- Supporting documentation, which includes copies of contracts, grants or any other agreement specific to senior/key personnel foreign appointments and/or employment with a foreign institution for all foreign activities and resources that are reported in Other Support. If the contracts, grants or other agreements are not in English, recipients must provide translated copies.
- Immediate notification of undisclosed Other Support. When a recipient organization discovers that a PI
 or other Senior/Key personnel on an active NIH grant failed to disclose Other Support information
 outside of Just-in-Time or the RPPR, as applicable, the recipient must submit updated Other Support to
 the Grants Management Specialist named in the Notice of Award as soon as it becomes known.

Updates to National Science Foundation Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending Support Formats

The National Science Foundation (NSF) - approved biographical sketch and current and pending support formats were updated to incorporate revisions in the Proposal & Award Policies & Procedures Guide (PAPPG) (NSF <u>22-1</u>) and must be used for proposals submitted or due on or after October 4, 2021.

The current formats are posted on the NSF <u>biographical sketch</u> and <u>current and pending support</u> websites. Updated system-related Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) are also available: <u>FAQs on using SciENcv</u> and <u>FAQs on using NSF fillable PDF</u>.
