#### Dependent Care Reimbursement with Externally Sponsored Awards

Recently, external funding agencies, such as the National Institutes of Health (NIH), have made certain types of dependent care expenses allowable on sponsored projects with the appropriate supporting documentation. Each agency and award have unique dollar limits.

The NIH published [Frequently Asked Questions](#) (FAQs) related to childcare costs, and they address topics such as eligibility, allowable costs, and how to submit a request.

#### National Institutes of Health Release Guidance for FY22 Salary Cap

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) released on February 10, 2022 the increase in salary cap from \$199,300 to \$203,700 for Executive Level II of the [Federal Executive pay scale](#).

NIH grantees may rebudget to accommodate the new salary cap for awards issued in specific years that were restricted to Executive Level II, but no additional funds will be provided to the grant awards to accommodate salary increases.

PERIS™ MyFunding has been updated to reflect the new salary cap.
