Proposal Submission Deadlines around Winter Recess

Due to the University Winter Recess closure, the Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP) will be closed:

Friday, December 23 through Monday, January 2, 2023

All proposals with deadlines that fall within Winter Recess should be submitted to OSP at least 4 business days before the first day of break. Additionally, proposals with due dates that fall within the first 3 days after a holiday break should be submitted prior to the break to allow at least 4 business days for review and submission to the Sponsor.

Example: A proposal is due to the Sponsor on Wednesday, December 28. The proposal should be routed to OSP *and* certified by the PI in MyFunding by no later than Monday, December 19.

REMINDER: New NIH Data Management and Sharing Policy Taking Effect January 2023

The new NIH Policy for Data Management and Sharing will go into effect on January 25, 2023 (see <u>NIH NOT-OD-21-013</u>). NIH staff compiled the following twelve resources as investigators and administrators prepare applications:

National Science Foundation Revises Award Terms and Conditions

The National Science Foundation (NSF) revised its <u>Award Terms and Conditions</u> for new NSF awards and funding amendments made on or after January 30, 2023.

Added to the terms and conditions is a new Article on Safe and Inclusive Work Environments for Off-Campus or Off-Site Research. Additional revisions have been incorporated for consistency with the most recent *Proposal & Award Policies & Procedures Guide* (PAPPG).
