Funding Agency Updates

National Institutes of Health Update Data Management and Sharing Costs

Effective for application due dates on or after October 5, 2023, the National Institutes of Health (NIH) will no longer require the use of the single Data Management and Sharing (DMS) cost line item. Instead DMS costs should be requested in the appropriate cost category (ex: personnel, supplies, etc.). Applicants must specify estimated DMS cost details within the “Budget Justification” attachment of the R&R Budget Form or “Additional Narrative Justification” attachment of the PHS 398 Modular Budget Form, according to the instructions.

National Science Foundation Announces Project Report Enhancements for Datasets and Research Materials

The National Science Foundation (NSF) made enhancements to the Project Reporting System in Research.gov to enable datasets and research materials to be entered as distinct product types that are managed and reviewed separately, effective July 24, 2023.
