Funding Agency Updates

National Institutes of Health (NIH) Operating Under a Continuing Resolution (CR), Affecting Funding Levels and Salary Cap

In <u>Notice NOT-OD-17-048</u>, the NIH announced that they will issue non-competing research grant awards at a level below that indicated on the most recent Notices of Award (generally up to 90% of the previously committed level) because of a CR that is in effect until April 28, 2017.

Although the Executive Level II salary cap was increased from \$185,100 to \$187,000 effective January 8, 2017, the NIH has announced that they will be providing additional guidance on their application of the salary cap once the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Appropriation for FY 2017 is enacted. Current NIH grantees are allowed to rebudget active awards to the new salary cap effective January 8, 2017 provided they have adequate funds and it is consistent with the institutional base salary. Note that the NIH will not be providing *additional* funds to cover the increased salary cap for existing grant awards. Revised Federal-Wide Research Terms and Conditions Now Published

On March 14, 2017, the National Science Foundation (NSF) published revised Research Terms and Conditions in the <u>Federal Register</u> to address and implement the Uniform Guidance. All Federal research agencies will be able to utilize this standard core set of administrative terms and conditions on research and research-related awards that are subject to 45 CFR Part 75, to the extent practicable.
