New Electronic Subaward Request Form

The Office of Research has partnered with Contraxx by Ecteon to develop a new electronic process for submitting outgoing subaward requests. Research Administrators can log into http://pi.tt/subawards to submit a subaward request to the Office of Research. This electronic form, which can be accessed from the Office of Research Forms page and Subawards page, replaces the paper Subaward Request Form and contains many of the same questions. Other features include:

- A <u>User's Guide</u> to help navigate the website
- Secure access through Pitt's Single Sign-On (SSO)
- Ability to start a subaward request, save it, and submit it at a later time
- Help text for questions
- Smart form logic, so that questions appear or disappear based on previous answers
- Subaward status updates
- Website communications from the Office of Research

The University of Pittsburgh subscribes to *Pivot*, a comprehensive database of funding opportunities. *Pivot* is accessible to the campus community through the <u>Office of Research website</u> and the <u>ULS databases</u>. Create a profile, search for funding, and identify potential collaborators using the database. Getting started is easy: a <u>Quick Start User Guide</u> and a <u>YouTube channel</u> provide step-by-step instructions and helpful tips.

NIH Updates Appendix Policy to Eliminate Clinical Trial-Related Materials

Effective for applications submitted to due dates on or after January 28, 2018, the NIH, Agency for Health Research and Quality (AHRQ), and National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) will no longer allow clinical trial-related materials to be included as Appendix materials.
